Article Submission Contract

The Meredith Herald welcomes submissions from Meredith students, faculty and staff of articles on any topic for publication in print or online. Submissions may be of any length, though they are unlikely to be accepted if they are longer than 600 words. An article may be submitted for consideration in any of our four sections: Features, News, A&E or Opinion. We do not accept submissions from anonymous sources; however, authors may request their name be withheld in print.

We consider only completed articles and do not provide guidance on ideas or proposals. Our editing staff will review your article for grammar, adherence to *Herald* style and basic content, but a piece requiring extensive edits will not be accepted. We welcome revisions and resubmissions and can provide feedback on what aspects of the piece need work. Other factors may also affect whether an article is suitable for publication in the newspaper or online, including space constraints, timeliness and relevance. You need not possess any special expertise to have your article considered, though, if you do, please explain.

We do our best to read all submissions promptly and will contact you within one week if we are interested in publishing your article. For articles being considered for print publishing, if an article is submitted less than one week before our layout date (every Tuesday before publishing), it is unlikely to be considered for the very next issue and will be deferred to the following issue if accepted. For articles being considered for online publishing, a publishing date will be chosen based on a reasonable timeline, including any editing.

To submit, type or copy/paste your article as plain text into an email addressed to themeredithherald@gmail.com with [Article Submission] as the subject line. Please include your name, your contact information and in which section you would prefer your piece be published. Please attach to the email a signed copy of the second page of this contract, or submit it in person to Joyner 111 at a time arranged by email. We do not accept article submissions via snail mail.
